Faith Comparisons

Abraham, the Father of Faith

How Abraham's Faith "Progressed"

- Still, whether it be in solitary moments or in the overall landscape of one's lifetime, progress of one's faith in God's promise is evident to all looking upon it. Gen. 22:1-19; Heb. 11:8-10, 17-19

Reflect upon your personal faith

- Our lives are so much more than the day to day struggles and pleasures of this life.
- Do you lay hold of God's promise to resurrect you to a life beyond mortality... the way Abraham did regarding his son? 1 Cor. 15:1-2
- Do you see moments when you've faltered and succeeded when faced with God's promise?
